

Sponsorship Scheme

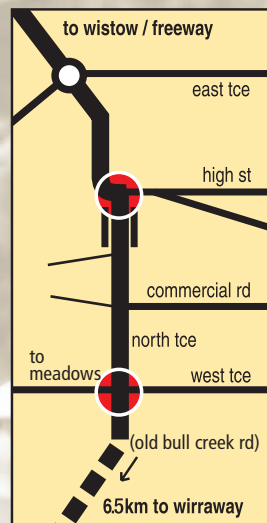
A special scheme provides for economically disadvantaged young people and groups to attend Wirraway free of charges, or at reduced rates. Enquiries may be made to the manager.

Take the **South Eastern Freeway to Mount Barker** and then **proceed to Strathalbyn via Wistow**. As you enter the built up area of Strathalbyn go straight ahead at the roundabout, then take the **first road to the right**, which has a sign directing you to Wirraway. The campsite is **6.5km along Old Bull Creek Road** on the right.

Wirraway

Wirraway is a not-for-profit programmed camp, which runs throughout the year for young people 10 years and over. It offers an opportunity to enjoy outdoor activities on 70ha of countryside, staying in buildings arranged in an 'old world' setting.

Experienced and qualified staff organise the activities, cater, and run all aspects of the programme.

School Groups

The camp is available to school groups for 1/2 week, 4 or 5 day camps on weekdays during term time.

Christianity

Wirraway draws its staff from the 'mainline' Christian churches. As part of the camp program, staff take time to explain the basics of the Christian faith. This is suitable for young people from all backgrounds.

Horse Riding

Our large indoor arena is the focus of our horse riding programme which includes group lessons and the possibility of trail rides on longer camps. All our horse riding instructors are qualified with Horse Safety Australia.

Activities

Other activities include a climbing wall, archery, low ropes course, mini golf, a swimming pool, trampolines, bush survival initiatives, and many other indoor and outdoor activities.

The 'Shed' provides a venue for indoor games such as table tennis, Foosball and eight ball. The 'Snack Bar' opens daily to sell sweets, drinks, Bibles, and novelty items.

The Climbing Wall

We have an expertly built 6 metre high climbing wall. With 6 'faces' (each 'face' having numerable 'ascents') it will challenge even the most adventurous young climber. It has proven to be a great hit with campers.

What to Bring

Sleeping bag, or blankets and sheets, pillow, torch, towel, soap, long pants for riding. Bathers in warm weather; sunscreen and hat. Safety helmets and riding boots are provided and will be worn when horse riding.
