Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Outdoor Recreation Training Package? In 1999 the Australian National Training Authority endorsed an Outdoor Recreation Industry Training Package, and it was revised in 2003 and 2006.

Qualification are made up of 'Units of Competency' in administration + risk management+ team work + group management in outdoor activities

What is involved in Assessment?

Students combine: experience working in camps, involvement with a recreation based business, work experience in an office, completion

Why gain a qualification?

- Increase job opportunities
- Increase personal knowledge
- Update existing knowledge
- Gain nationally recognised qualifications
- Network in the industry

Who will the course suit?

Certificate III is suitable for those wanting to work unsupervised in the recreation industry...they should be a minimum of 18 years of age by the end of the course.

The student is required to demonstrate skills associated with the area that they are being assessed in, in a variety of situations

How long does a course take?

One year full time is the minimum required to complete Certificate III : around 830

hours including on the job training, theory sessions and skill development.

When will the course start?

Feb 2009
How much will the course cost?
Students will be recruited by BCSA and El Shaddai which will cover the costs of the course. The official components of the course will run for 40 weeks (matching the school term dates) made up of a 2 hour theory session each week and extensive on the job training and supervised practical work in the home campsites; with some practical and all theory sessions held at Wirraway. AUSTUDY is available for eligible students. Traineeships may be negotiated by the organizing bodies.

A food handling unit must be included as one of the elective 'choices' under this scheme as this area is a basic need in the camping industry, unless the student has pre-existing formal training in this area.

Student support:

Support will be provided for students with low literacy skills through Wirraway Training if required, and all efforts will be made to assist candidates to complete their course. Extra resources for each unit are available through Wirraway Training in the form of reading materials, books and videos.

Assessment will be "holistic" and ongoing...in other words as candidates demonstrate their competencies in any area these will be recorded, often with a variety of competencies being observed in a given situation. For Example: A situation could arise where during an archery session, an assessor is able to confirm the student is competent in dealing with conflict, planning the session, responding to weather conditions, and facilitating the group all within the one session ...this is holistic assessment. Other assessments will involve completion of workbooks and demonstrating practical skills.
